## Visiting families and friends

Family members and friends of our patients are always welcome at St. Maarten Medical Center.

To locate which room a patient is staying, please ask the assistants at the Service Desk located immediately inside the Main Entrance to SMMC.

A quiet and peaceful environment should be maintained throughout the hospital and also during visiting hours. We have three visiting periods per day designed to meet the public and patient's needs.

## VISITING HOURS

### Medical/Surgical Ward and OBGYN Ward:

*Open Ward and Semi Private Rooms:*

11:30am - 12:30pm

03:30pm - 04:30 pm. Children are allowed to visit.

06:00pm - 07:30pm

*Private Rooms:*

11:30am –07:30pm. Children are allowed to visit.

### Pediatric Ward:

11:30am - 12:30pm

03:30pm - 04:30 pm. Children are allowed to visit.

06:00pm - 07:30pm

### Intensive Care Unit (ICU):

*Category High Care:*

At the top of each hour, patients can be visited for a maximum of 10 minutes. The visit must be coordinated by the ICU nurse in charge.

*Category Medium and Low Care:*

10:00am – 10:20am

02:00pm – 02:20pm

08:00pm – 08:20pm

*Early visitors are requested to have a seat in the Main Patio until the doors to the patient wards are opened for visiting hours. Persons waiting on information on patients in the Delivery Room or Operation Room are also requested to sit on our open air Main Patio until allowed to see the patient or speak to his/her doctor.*

## Visitor Guidelines

### Visitors' Health

Persons with colds, flu or cold sores are discouraged from visiting patients. Parents may still visit but may need to wear a mask. You may be advised not to kiss your baby or child. More frequent hand washing is also advised.

### Children Visitors

- ◆ Children less than 12 years may only visit patients on the Medical/Surgical, OB-GYN and Pediatric wards.
- ◆ Children are prohibited from visiting the ICU and patients who are in medical isolation.
- ◆ For the protection of our newborns on the OB-GYN ward, siblings of the newborn are the only children less than 12 who are allowed to visit.
- ◆ Children visitors must at all times be accompanied by a responsible adult. Noisy or disruptive children will be asked to leave the wards.

### Visiting Isolated Patients

Patients in medical isolation may only have visitors from their direct family household. Visitors are requested to follow all instructions given by the nurse pertaining to wearing a gown, mask and proper hand washing before entering and leaving the room.

### Visiting Patients in the ICU

Flowers and plants are not allowed in the ICU. Cell phones must be switched off before entering; usage of cell phones is strictly prohibited.

### Code of Conduct

- ◆ No smoking is allowed in the hospital, except in the designated area. All cigarette butts must be discarded in the ash tray.
- ◆ Littering of cigarette butts, soda cans, paper towels etc. is strictly forbidden. Kindly deposit such articles in the waste receptacle bin.
- ◆ The use of alcoholic beverages and drugs is not allowed in the hospital.
- ◆ Visitors sitting on beds are strictly forbidden.
- ◆ Visitors are not allowed to eat or drink in the patient rooms.
